

NDG Linux Courses – Cisco NetAcad™ NetAcad Course Setup Documentation

Instructors and Administrators

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Network Development Group is offering NDG Linux courses for institutions participating in the Cisco Networking Academy® program. In order for learners to access the NDG Linux course materials, instructors will first need to create and administrate a class within the Cisco Networking Academy.

While instructors are able to modify the class structure and content within the NetAcad LMS, NDG specifically does **NOT** recommend adding or changing the course content. Any changes made are the sole responsibility of the instructors and/or the academic institution offering the class. With the exception of hiding existing sections of content, no support services are offered for classes that have course content modified. It is not permissible to export the NDG Linux course content for use outside of the NetAcad or other LMS without the written consent of NDG.


Do **NOT** attempt to create a class by importing old NDG Linux course content or content from another NDG Linux course into a new class. Classes should always be created using the following method using the most recent template and course content.

Creating a New Class in the Cisco Networking Academy

 Log in to the Cisco Networking Academy with your instructor account. From the My NetAcad homepage, select Create Course.




2. From the menu, select which NDG Linux course you would like to create and click Continue.





3. Select the language and version of the course materials you would like to use.




NDG Linux courses are typically offered in two versions, *instructor-led* and *self-paced*. Course content is identical between the two, but *self-paced* classes are designed to run without any input from instructors.

Self-paced classes have all exams automatically enabled by default, remove all prerequisites, and grade students as complete upon finishing the final exam and course feedback.


Instructor-led classes require active involvement from an instructor in order to function correctly. This includes activating exams and manually grading students as complete.

4. Input a Course ID, Course Name, Start Date, and End Date. Note all NetAcad classes have a maximum duration of one year, but can be set to a shorter time if desired. Click **Continue** when finished.





5. Verify that the information is complete, and click **Publish Now**.



Frequently Asked Questions

1. How long will it take to complete the course?

The NDG Linux courses are designed to be taught for a semester or quarter, but academies and instructors are encouraged to use the material based on the unique needs of the academic institution and students. For each of the courses, NDG Linux Essentials, NDG Linux I, and NDG Linux II, learners are expected to take approximately 70 hours to complete all materials.

2. What are the system requirements?

NDG recommends using a desktop operating system (Windows, Mac, or Linux) with a physical keyboard. Smartphones and tablet devices are **not** supported. The two most recent production releases (not nightly or beta builds) of the following web browsers are recommended and supported:

- Google Chrome
- Apple Safari
- Mozilla Firefox

3. Do I need any additional equipment for the course?

No additional equipment is required for the NDG Linux courses.

5. Is training required for instructors?

No, instructor training is not required for instructors at this time. Instructors are encouraged to attain the Linux Essentials Professional Development Certificate, complete the NetAcad Academy Orientation course, and the self-paced NDG Linux courses prior to teaching the materials. NDG may adjust the instructor qualification rules if learner feedback indicates that academic institutions or instructors are not successfully teaching the material.

6. Are there any instructor materials or classroom aids available?

Yes, instructors have access to the content, lab exercises, and virtual machines for practice. PowerPoint slides have been developed for classroom lectures. Each module has a corresponding PowerPoint slide deck. PowerPoint slide decks are accessible via instructor resources in the **Help & Resources** module of the course.

7. Does the course include assessments?

At the end of each module, questions are presented to the learner as a graded chapter exam. All chapter exams include ten questions, and the midterm and final exams are forty questions each. All questions are scored, and results are posted in the gradebook. Exams are randomly generated on demand from a pool of available questions.

8. How do you enable assessments for this course?

Instructor-led classes require exams to be activated in order for students to access them. For assistance with this process, refer to the support documentation found here:
